Get out and enjoy Montauk off season!



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







# MONTAUK SALT CAVE

is a Panacea for Mind, Body, and Soul...and it's Spreading

#### Manhattan and Huntington can now Breathe the Air

Here we lie on ergonomic lounge chairs, covered in soft red blankets, taking deep breaths of the world's purest healing salt in the Montauk Salt Cave. In this dark, serene space we can only see a soft orange and red glow on the walls emanating from the salt lamps around us. Overhead, in a roof made of 8 tons of salt from the Himalayan Mountains of Pakistan, are hundreds of tiny shining white lights that look like stars twinkling in the night sky.

There are six women taking this therapeutic salt treatment from different places around Long Island. Their group had come down for the day to relax and unwind before hitting the beach. As I immersed my bare toes in the salt crystals on the floor of this cave, my mind wandered away from the usual stresses and I felt like I was floating. Mellow music played in the background.

Today we were in for a special treat, as Reiki Master healer Rodrigo Apiolaza, of Chile, was here to help clear and balance our energy fields. Standing in the darkened cave, he first led us in a guided meditation, telling us to "picture your body surrounded by a blue light.... see a crystal, and picture yourself going into it..." After the

meditation, he came to each person individually and ran his hands over their energy field, clearing away blocks and stress. Sometimes he sprinkled a little salt over us as he waved his arms.

Later, he explained that he tries to clear the "chakras" of the body, which are associated with different parts of our anatomy, and which hold in blocks and negative patterns that can limit us in our growth. He tries to free up the energy of the body, mind and spirit.

Throughout our 45-minute session in the salt cave, I noticed that I gradually felt lighter and much more relaxed, even centered. And it was 10:30 in the mornina when I'm usually stressed beyond words. I am not a morning person. And while I don't have breathing problems, thus no acute frame of reference...the air felt fresh and easy to take in, as though my lungs were tuned up.

Shannon Coppola, owner of the now-famous Montauk Salt Cave, explained to us beforehand that salt therapy is a natural way to heal many different health issues, primarily asthma, alleraies, cystic fibrosis, and COPD. It is also helpful for people suffering from sinusitis, colds, and influenza. The salt can also be a remedy for skin conditions, Lyme disease, migraines and arthritis, along with digestive disorders. And it's also a great way to relax and meditate, something I always need.

Shannon and her husband, Peter Coppola, built the Montauk Salt Cave in 2015 to help their son recover from his severe allergies. "We were looking for something besides medicines," she said, sitting at the front desk where she checks in people at hourly intervals. "We checked out a salt cave in New Jersey, and it really helped our son... he was finally able to sleep through the night, and his cough went away after just two visits."

The Coppolas, who live full-time in Montauk, enlisted the help of Dr. Margaret Smiechowski, who has built salt caves around the country, the Thomas Lavin

Construction Company of Montauk, and Jose Carmona, an East Hampton carpenter, to build the Montauk Salt Cave. After visiting the family's Cave regularly, their 8-year-old son is now unmedicated but still comes once a week because he is allergic to goldenrod, found in Montauk.

"Our mission is to help people here. I'm excited that it's become a health and spiritual mecca," Shannon said, "as evidenced by the fact that people come here from all over the New York Metro and Long Island area for treatments."

Four of the women here today during my visit heard about the Montauk Salt Cave on Facebook and came out for a healing treatment. Suzanne Welch, 47, of Bellport, said she was on a quest to stop smoking so she wanted to clean out her lungs. "I loved the air...it was so much cleaner, and I have also started running," she said. Her friend, Nicole Francis, 42, of Bellport, said she could breathe better and that her skin felt lighter afterwards. Jodie Frace, of Lake Ronkonkoma, said, "I have had sinus infections, and I was able to breathe much better in there."

Shannon holds classes in the salt cave, including Restorative Yoga, Reiki and Singing Bowls. She even has an "Intro to Meditation and Reiki For Children" class. There is also a wonderful store in the front selling salt lamps and therapies, clothes, rocks and gems, soy candles, bags, totes, and handmade jewelry.

With the success of the Montauk Cave. Shannon and Peter have built two more: The Montauk Salt Cave West, at 169 New York Avenue in Huntington, and the Montauk Salt Cave Downtown, at 90 East 10th Street, between 3rd and 4th Avenues in Manhattan. Each will have two salt caves, one for adults and one for children. The Manhattan cave opens in September.

And why did she name them all after the "Montauk" Salt Cave? "I wanted to keep the Montauk vibe alive in all the caves...I even put up photographs of the Montauk Lighthouse, Ditch Plains surfers, and the old East Deck Motel in all of them," she said.



# Saltbox Restaurant's Secret is Out

Superstar Chef Nadia Ovalles Wields Umami, Spice, and Creativity at Saltbox on Montauk Circle

Walking into Saltbox you might get the impression that it's another Hamptons pub-style restaurant, replete with casually rustic and beachy accents, but you'd be wrong. Distinguishing Saltbox is its creative menu, food, and flavors created by Chef Nadia Ovalles.

She blends her keen sense of seasonings and spices to kick up the tastes of her seafood, meats and side dishes. A recurring thought as I ate was that Saltbox should not be keeping this girl a secret.

Saltbox Restaurant & Bar is tucked away inside one of Carl Fisher's original Tudor-style buildings across from the Montauk Tower on the village green. Although in its third year, Saltbox is still relatively new by Montauk standards. It replaced the popular O'Murphy's Pub, which was there for decades before movina to its present Montauk Harbor location. There

are small traditional tables and a few long picnic tables, a full, lively bar, and lots of nautical framed artwork of surfers, waves, mermaids, and fishermen on the walls. Its large windows look out on the Montauk Circle and the lovely village green. You can dine al fresco along the sidewalk

When asked about the name, "Saltbox," Nadia explained that the restaurant was named after the old saltbox cottages that remain sprinkled around Montauk. One of the better-known examples is Second

House Museum on Main Street just west of town.

"My food is a fusion of what Montauk has to offer, with a twist," Nadia says, taking a break from the hot kitchen on a recent summer evening. At 32, she has already cooked in some of the world's best restaurants. from her Caribbean roots to NYC's well-known eatery, Nobu 57, a blend of Asian and Peruvian cuisine, and the Italian restaurant, Marea. She got her start at the Art Institute of New York City.

Nadia explains that she's a specialist with umami,

aka "savory taste", which is considered one of the five basic tastes (along with sweetness, sourness, bitterness, and saltiness). Commensurately her cooking honors all five human senses... and it shows in her creations at Saltbox with ridiculously tasty dishes for the palette that also delight our other senses, eyes included.

But I'm getting ahead. Wayne Connolly, the personable manager and bartender, came over that night and helped us select from a creative menu of specialty cocktails as preamble to Nadia's delicacies. We tried the Ditch Punch, of Bacardi white rum, hibiscus, pineapple and fresh lime juice...light, smooth and summery, and the Aji Margarita, of Avion silver tequila, chili peppers, orange liquor, and lime juice...peppery, spicy and delicious. There is also a Mango Coconut Martini for the martini lovers and a Lazy Point Iced Tea, with citrus vodka. I sipped and marveled at the unique silverware on the table. It has a creative fishtail motif. Verv Montauk.

To the food. Mark, our waiter, brought out a big bowl of Montauk Steamed Mussels in a light, spicy tomato broth, which was a nice change

from the usual white wine and garlic. The mussels were fresh and tender, served with soft warm bread for soaking up the incredible sauce. Mark then came over with some of Nadia's special garlic fries, which have garlic mojo, cotija cheese, parsley, and a savory truffle mayo. Not just your usual French fries.

Sampling a few more appetizers, we chose the Tuna Poke, (in case you're wondering, this is pronounced "po-kay", OK?, and there is no accent over the e - I looked it up) which was chunks of fresh raw tuna, mixed with a tangy Chipotle mayo and served on fried pita triangles...savory, crunchy and delicious. Next up was a sight to behold; our waiter carried out two Lobster Sliders perched on a "hammock" above two Salty Bloody Marys. The Lobster Roll, or sliders, are also very fresh and a favorite at Saltbox. They go well with the zesty Bloody Marys, a great summer drink.

One of Saltbox's most popular appetizers is Nadia's signature dish, the crunchy, savory Chicken Wings. Nadia energizes them with a spicy Korean twist and pairs them with House ranch dressing. "All our sauces and dressings are made in-house,"

said Nadia, who works alongside her Sous Chef, Alex Figueroa.

My dining partner and I shared an entree of Seared Scallops, which was one of our favorites. It consisted of four giant sea scallops perfectly cooked so they were juicy and succulent, resting on a bed of warm quinoa salad with cilantro ialapeno gioli. The combination was original and divine. We shared another

entree of Clams Marinara with Pasta, which was no ordinary spaghetti with clam sauce. Nadia whipped up some fresh Korean spices and flavors, like Gochujang, for the red sauce, served over thin pasta with baby hard clams. "It's simple, but delicious," she said. "That's the trick"

After this wonderful meal we simply had no room for dessert,

### Montauk Dance Scene Starts at Two

At a young age, Montauker Laura Sisco couldn't stop moving. "I remember standing in front of the glass oven door in my family's kitchen, working on my dance moves. "I remember tellina my friends, who were also in the frenzy of picking a college, that my major was going to be dance. They gave me a strange look, like 'what are you going to do with a degree in dance?' I had no plan B!," she laughed.

After being accepted to Adelphi University, Laura immersed herself dancing five days a week - ballet and

After graduating she became the Cultural Arts Coordinator at the YMCA in East Hampton, teaching dance. At one point, she auditioned for the Rockettes but ultimately decided to pursue her true calling: teaching. "Teaching children is a challenge," she said. "Each child learns differently so I adjust the way I teach to find the best way to help them achieve their personal best. That is the most rewarding part of this career," she explains.

As fate would have it, Laura eventually became the Musical Director at East Hampton High School, where she still stages one musical production per year, most recently In the Heights





**BEACH FIRES** are allowed on main town beaches from 5pm – 12am but must be fully contained in a metal container. Other regulations apply. Go to onmontauk. com/beach-fire-regulations for a complete list of all requirements.

### **FOUR WHEEL DRIVE**

permits for the main town beaches can be purchased at the Town Hall Annex in the Montauk Playhouse. Free to town residents. they cost \$275 per year for non-residents. No vehicles allowed on the beaches 10am - 6pm, May 21- September 15. Other beaches around Montauk require various state or county driving permits. Read posted signs.

**PUBLIC PARKING** is free at the Kirk Park Beach, across from 7-11 and IGA Supermarket, and \$10 at Hither Hills State Park. Many hotels and motels provide temporary permits for their guests. Other beaches require a permit, free for residents, but \$375 per year for non-residents, for sale at the Town Hall Annex. The Hither Hills Neighborhood beach along Old Montauk Highway has four private parking areas for neighborhood residents

CEAN SWIMMING CAN BE FUN, BUT THE POWER OF THE WATER CAN OVERWHELM EVEN EXPERIENCED SWIMMERS CAUGHT IN A STRONG current, or rip. To be safe, always swim at a beach with a lifeauard and never swim alone. Lifeguards are generally on duty at all public beaches from 10am-5pm through Labor Day.

### **AMSTERDAM BEACH**

### (remote, unspoiled, quiet, hike to access, no facilities, doas OK)

Walk the trail at Amsterdam Beach State Park and be rewarded by one of the most breathtaking vistas of unspoiled shoreline on the east coast. Meander along the intermittently sandy and rocky shoreline eastward or westward and be humbled. The 50-minute round-trip wooded hike includes a tunnel of American Holly and several exotic large oaks. Bring insect repellant and water as the beach has no facilities, no lifequards...and probably no other

### **DITCH PLAINS BEACH**

### (surfer spot, families, can get crowded, permit parking)

Popular with surfers, this beach is two miles east of the village on the ocean with parking by permit only at two parking areas. The super long break makes surfing ideal for newbies or veteran lona-boarders. This iconic

beach has beautiful cliffs rising at its western end at Shadmoor Park. restrooms, outdoor showers, lifequards during the summer season, and concession trailers that serve more than iust snacks.

### **EDISON BEACH**

(sandy, walkable from village hotels, close to everything, limited parking)

At the heart of the Village at the end of South Edison Street, this popular beach has a lifeauard on duty during the summer months, restaurants, restrooms, and stores nearby. Limited public parking. Be mindful of the dunes, which were recently stabilized.


### **GIN BEACH**

(sound side, calm, families, boat watching, walk to Shagwong point, permit parking)

At the end of East Lake Drive on Block Island Sound: and named for the cattle gins, or pens, that resided here for hundreds of years, Gin Beach is great for families with children, with gentle water and sandy beaches. You can watch the boats come in and out of Montauk Harbor, or take a walk on the letty. Parking by permit only. Restrooms, outdoor showers, a concession trailer, lifequards during the summer season, and a nearby restaurant provide all the family needs for a day at the beach.

### HITHER HILLS STATE PARK (public parking, many facilities, sandy, families)

Four miles west of town on Old Montauk Highway. Lifequards daily from mid June-Labor Day. Noncampers pay a \$10 parking fee. Nice playground, picnic tables, outdoor showers, restrooms, a changing area, and a general store.



### KIRK PARK BEACH

(main town beach with free parking area; wide, sandy, open, families) West of the Village by the IGA supermarket, this sandy beach stretches over 500 feet. Park for free at Kirk Park parking lot. Public restrooms located next to the parking lot. Lifequards, restaurants and stores are within walking distance, along with a park and picnic area across the street. The dunes were recently stabilized and stairways were put in place.

### **NAVY ROAD BEACH**

(sound side, calm, pebbly, kayak launch, families, no facilities, permit parking)

On beautiful Fort Pond Bay at the end of 2nd House Rd. Great for launching kayaks, paddleboards, and small boats. A favorite spot for locals and families. The beach is pebbly, so take swim shoes. Parking by permit only. Dine waterside at Navy Beach, just down the beach. Boats and small vachts frequently moor in the Bay.

### THE OTHER BEACHES

(walkable even if not parkable)

Montauk, surrounded by water on three sides, has many more beaches, but most of them are not protected by lifequards and parking is not straightforward. For those who enjoy walking the beach, there are many options, as all beaches are public up to the high tide mark. A popular walk is from the village to Ditch Plains beach, where you see the cliffs of Shadmoor on the way. At high tide parts of the beach may be impassable.







deservedly so. To do it successfully you'll need braided line at 30+ pound test and a nice selection of bucktails and plugs. Always crush your barbs, bring fish in quickly, and release safely what you won't keep. Cast out by Camp Hero, the Lighthouse, and Gin Beach, plus all the south side beaches from Montauk Point to Hither Hills campground. The top seasons for surfcasting are spring and fall, when stripers linger off Montauk before migrating, but our big blues can be found from July through October. Permits to park after hours at Camp Hero and the Montauk Point Lighthouse Parking Lot or on the beach by the Lighthouse are sold at Montauk Downs, 631-668-5000. Purchase Gin Beach driving permits at the park office at the end of East Lake Drive. Note: A license (it's free) is required to fish beaches in NY State. Acquire your Marine Fishing License at dec.ny.gov.

### FRESHWATER FISHING

Bass, sunfish, perch, and walleves inhabit Montauk's ponds and lakes. Fort Pond is the largest, but others are deep in the woods, like Oyster Pond in Montauk Point State Park or Fresh Pond in Hither Hills State Park. Fresh water fishing requires a license—ask at the NY State Park office at Montauk Downs.

Fishing at Big Reed Pond in Theodore Roosevelt County Park requires a "Green Key" card, available at Montauk Downs.

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# Crush, Snip, and Tighten

Fish better, faster, and safer with crushed barbs and clipped trebles.

Here we go!! The excitement, rush, sleepless nights, missed work, exhausting disappointment, and raw exhilaration of fall fishing in Montauk is upon us. Bass in the rips, on the rocks, under the light...albies exploding bait everywhere, monster blues pushing bunker onto the beach, arms turned to jelly...you know the routine. Fall fishing... yet another reason to love it here at the End.

For you recreational anglers, both ocean-going and shore-bound, this addictive, ritualistic pursuit of nature's bounty can be improved in myriad ways if you adopt the practice of crushing your barbs and clipping treble hooks into doubles, or replacing them altogether with singles. After all, barbed and trebled hooks are vestiges of ancient times when conservation was unknown and bringing fish home was not optional. Today, recreational angling is sport, pastime, addiction, and passion, not necessity, so eliminating those age-old hook elements born of raw need will deliver multiple benefits...with no downside. I've been doing this for years now and have become a much better angler for it, and virtually never lose fish, unless I want to.

## Tight, Fast...Good; Slow, Lazy...Bad

Crushing and clipping down trebles (specifically, trebles should be replaced by singles for trailing hooks, cut to doubles when in the middle) compels you to keep your line tight the whole time during the retrieve, not just when the fish is running. Conscious of your newly barbless lure, you'll realize that what you thought was a tight line is tight only when the fish

is pulling against you. You'll learn quickly to expect and anticipate those inevitable changes of direction and speed up your retrieve, sometimes dramatically, to keep the line tight. This gets the fish in much faster and naturally allows for much quicker release. Great stuff: more catches, cleaner releases, less exhausted fish, a better tactician.

It gets better. Contrary to common belief, most fish don't just slip off easily from a barbless lure, much less from a treble that's been cut to a double... but you can let them off virtually any time, such as when you're targeting bass but the blues keep hitting. Once you've hooked a fish vou don't want, just give it lots of slack for a few seconds so its panic subsides; it usually throws the hook now. If

it doesn't, retrieve a bit till the line tightens and it gets another panic attack, add in a few jerks followed by total slack. It'll get off. If not, bring it into the wash or boatside tight and then let it roll in the waves or flop around near the surface with slack again. If it's still on by this point (rare, in my experience) you'll have to unhook it, which is effortless with no barb.

People frequently say, "tough luck" or "keep it tight" when they see me "lose" lots of fish. When I tell them I'm not losing them, but just letting them off because I don't want to waste time with blues while targeting bass, they light up. Similarly, when I'm having fun with blues hitting every cast, I usually

get them into the wash and let them go rather than get my hands into it. This way I can catch twice the number of fish as the next guy who must drag each one in and unhook it with pliers.

## Dead Fish Don't **Explode on Lures**

Let's keep it real. Crushing barbs and cutting trebles down to doubles saves fish. Barbs, even in



the hands of the most experienced angler, do bad damage to fish, and trebles...fuhgeddabouditt. Most fish we recreational anglers catch we don't keep. Many of us don't even eat fish. My family and I, it so happens, eat a lot of it, so fishing is both fun

and a culinary delight. So, for me, every released fish is a potentially scrumptious meal down road. And since we have kids...it's another thrilling catch for them one day, too.

Even if you don't share my culinary

and succession baggage, keep in mind that every manaled fish released with barb or treble damage is one less that will breed, chase bait, and explode on your lure...meaning one less you might catch one day.

## **Emergency Rooms Suck**

A crushed barb of prevention is worth fifty pounds of cure. That is, you can't reel in fifty-pound cows if vour favorite darter is stuck in vour


palm. With no barb, simply back out that errant hook, wherever it's stuck, and move on. If you thought dental insurance was a racket, you haven't lived through the financial machinations and mental pain of an emergency room visit. Fear of that is probably what compels many to clumsily try taking hooks out on their own, only to end up at the hospital anyway. One common assertion is to simply keep pushing an errant hook through the skin rather than trying to back it out. OK, imagine trying that with a treble, or even double, hook.

So don't wait until the inevitable happens, crush the barbs on every hook before you start using them.

## The Right Tool

Simple. Lineman's, or side-cutting, plyers, can do it all. Most other pliers can crush the barbs but lineman pliers can also easily cut the third hook off the treble with the wire cutter edge. Make sure you get the hook well into the crotch of the cutter and anale it properly...there isn't much room to do it wrong. It still takes elbow grease, but after a few you'll get the hang of it.

Get out there. Fast lines.



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ONTAUK IS SURROUNDED BY WATER, AND TRAILS...THAT MEANDER THROUGH ACRES OF UNSPOILED PARKS THAT EXIST FOR US AND OUR wildlife. White-tailed deer, foxes, raccoons, woodchucks, squirrels, opossums, and chipmunks abound. Watch for deer while driving! Rare and majestic birds also frequent the End. You may spot an osprey, red-tailed hawk, piping plover, or even a bald eagle. Sizable concentrations of migrating birds rest in the waters off Montauk Point while seals inhabit our rocky shores during the winter months. Gannets torpedo into the ocean in fall seeking bait fish. You get the picture...you're in a natural paradise. Trail Maps are available at the Montauk Bike Shop and the Town Hall Annex in the Montauk Playhouse.

## AMSTERDAM BEACH PRESERVE (Great hike to the beach)

A 200-acre passive use park stretching from Ranch Road at Indian Field on the east to the Montauk Association houses (seven cottages designed by the firm of McKim, Mead and White in the 1880's) to the west. It is bordered on the north by Montauk Highway and extends southward to the Atlantic Ocean and the ocean beach. The natural topography, called "Montauk Moorlands," has tidal and freshwater wetlands interspersed throughout maritime shrub lands. This main trail head on Montauk Highway begins a one-mile hike to the ocean bluffs taking you through a holly arbor and across streams. The hilly trail affords peeks of ocean through the brambles and ends at the ocean beach and bluffs. This easy-to-navigate trail offers a unique reward of unspoiled coastal beauty.

## **HIKING TIPS**

- 1. Buy a trail map. Although major trails are marked, many divergent ones are not. At times during the year, leaf cover can mask main trails, making it easy to get lost on side trails or even deer paths.
- 2. After heavy rains some trails are completely or partially underwater. The Montauk Bike Shop in the village will answer any questions and sells trail maps.
- 3. AVOID TICKS: With a few simple precautions, hikers and walkers can enjoy walks through our beautiful woodlands and avoid the menace of ticks. Experts recommend that you stay on the trails, wear light colors, make sure you are well covered, and use an insect repellent. Ticks tend to congregate on tall grasses, so avoid walking through these areas. After you walk or bike, check the family for ticks, particularly tiny deer ticks, which may carry Lyme disease.

#### CAMP HERO STATE PARK

This 415-acre State Park is a decommissioned military installation converted to a state park in 2002 and a National Historic Site (also the home of conspiracy theories linked to the Philadelphia project). Several buildings, bunkers, batteries, and an old radar building remain, although they are off limits to the public. Roads cross the park, along with an extensive system of trails for hiking, bicycling, horseback riding, a beach used by surfers and surfcasters, a picnic area with grills and an old maritime forest. Park at Camp Hero Park (just west of the lighthouse) for trails and roads through Camp Hero. Parking fee is \$8 in

season. Open daily year-round from sunrise to sunset. You can also park your car on Camp Hero Road (a right turn four miles east of the village, not to be confused with the entrance to Camp Hero Park) to hike Point Woods Trail, one of Montauk's most beautiful trails, taking you

south of the Montauk Highway all the way to the bluffs. Attractions: views of pristine beaches, cliffs, the lighthouse, military buildings, and an old maritime forest

### **CULLODEN**

This park is named after the HMS Culloden, a British 74-gun warship sailing with the Channel Fleet during the American Revolutionary War. The natural wooded area leading up to the shoreline of Culloden is also public. The trailhead is on the left side of Flamingo Road next to a small plague commemorating the shipwreck. The marked trail from the parking area to Culloden Point is less than a mile. The natural wooded area and shoreline has seen little change from the days when the Montauketts lived here in a world of hidden ponds, specimen trees, wetlands, and a beautiful shoreline. Attractions: Views of the bluffs at Culloden Point.

# EDDIE ECKER COUNTY PARK (Great dog spot)

Located at the end of Navy Road near Rocky Point, the park has a parking lot, a dock suitable for fishing, and a rocky beach. Offers easy access to trails in Hither Woods Preserve. Good place for launching kayaks and canoes. Take your dogs to play. Open year round.

## FORT POND HOUSE AT CAROL MORRISON PARK

The Fort Pond House and Carol Morrison Park are located on a four-acre site in the Shepherd's Neck area of Montauk overlooking Fort Pond. Carol Morrison was a well-loved conservationist and it is appropriate that this park, which narrowly escaped being sold to private developers in 2010, should be named after her. The park is open from dawn to dusk and the house is available for meetings and other events by appointment through the East Hampton Town Recreation Department.

### HITHER HILLS STATE PARK

Located four miles west of the village of Montauk on Old Montauk Highway, with a two-and-a-half-mile beach along the Atlantic Ocean and 1,755 acres of parkland. Hither Hills has 168 campsites which can be reserved through **ReserveAmerica.com**, along with hiking and nature trails. Activities include ocean swimming, saltwater fishing, square dancing, guided nature hikes, and children's programs. Noncampers are welcome, but must pay a \$10 daily parking fee. Open year round


from sunrise to sunset. (631-668-2554). Hither Hills State Park along with Hither Woods Preserve and Lee Koppelman Nature Preserve form adjacent multi-use parks containing 3,000 acres with 18 different trails covering over 40 miles of terrain. Bike or hike to Fresh Pond, or take a beautiful coastal walk at Rocky Point: these loops are suitable for both walking and mountain biking. Here, trails, roads, and places retain their old colorful names. Even though the trails are blazed with color-coded markers, hikers should take maps. Park at either the overlook at Hither Woods, the recycling center (1.5 miles west of the village on Montauk Highway), or at the Navy Road (Eddie Ecker Park) parking lot. The Montauk Bike Shop in the village arranges group and corporate tours, rents mountain bikes, and gives advice. Attractions: Fresh Pond; trails skirting Block Island Sound, Napeague beach, and dunes.

## **KIRK PARK**

This quaint three-acre park, just west of the village, is maintained by the Montauk Village Association. It includes Fort Pond, which is the second largest freshwater lake on Long Island, a picnic area, a pavilion on Fort Pond, and it's next to Second House Museum and Montauk Indian Museum. The park hosts events year-round.

### MONTAUK DOWNS STATE PARK

A 160-acre park that has an 18-hole public golf course (see Landsports). It also has a driving range, a putting green,

and six Har-True tennis courts. A large outdoor pool and a wading pool for children is open in summer. 631-668-5000.

## MONTAUK MOUNTAIN

A six-acre preserve area maintained by the Nature Conservancy. To get there, follow Second House Road north 0.7 miles to an asphalt road on the left. Park at the end of the asphalt road by the Nature Conservancy sign. The preserve is at the end of the road past the last house on the riaht.

## MONTAUK POINT STATE PARK

This 724-acre park at the site of the Montauk Point Lighthouse offers breathtaking views of the sea, Block Island Sound, and Block Island to the northeast, and is great for bird watching year round and seal watching in the winter months. Park your car and set off on foot to explore the area. Ask for a Montauk Point State Park trail map at the toll booth. The park has surfcasting,

five miles of marked and unmarked hiking trails, a picnic area with tables, a playground, a restaurant, a gift shop, and restrooms. Daily parking costs \$8. The Montauk Point Lighthouse, a museum run by the Montauk Historical Society, is open to the public daily in season.

This park is contiguous with Camp Hero Park and the Sanctuary and there are several hiking trails that cross them. To the north of Montauk Highway, look for signs for Money Pond Trail, Oyster Pond trail and the Seal Haul Out Trail, where seals can be seen on the rocks just offshore from December through April. Attractions: beautiful rugged shorelines, migrating birds, hidden ponds, seals in the winter.

## SHADMOOR STATE PARK

Located two miles east of the village on Montauk Highway, this 99-acre tract of land has a half mile of ocean frontage where tall clay cliffs plunge down to a pebble strewn beach. If you are comina by car, park in the parking lot at the

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

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entrance to the park. About 30 percent of Shadmoor is freshwater wetlands with several small ponds hidden in the thickets. Trails and dirt roads lead to the bluffs from the entrance on Montauk Highway, offering an easy, though sometimes muddy, walk. A passive-use park, Shadmoor was home to two WWII gun emplacement sites trained on offshore waters to deter German submarines. A good family hike. Attractions: dramatic vistas of Montauk shoreline, sea and rolling waves, easy hike.

## MONTAUK COUNTY PARK

Two entrances: one at the end of East Lake Drive just north of the airport, where the park office is located, and the other at Third House, three miles east of the village on Montauk Highway. A total of 1,126 acres features three and a half miles of color coded nature trails restricted for hiking (a self-guided nature trail brochure is available), five miles of bridle paths, a picnic area, freshwater fishing and canoeing at Big Reed Pond, surfcasting

on the outer beach (Gin Beach and Shagwong Point), and hunting in the winter, in season. Camping is permitted for up to seven days from April through November on the outer beach for fourwheel drive vehicles with permits that are self-contained trailers. Tents are not allowed. You must have a Suffolk County Green Card, suffolkcountyny. gov. The view of Big Reed Pond from the observation deck on the blue trail. will make you understand why Bia Reed Pond is a Registered Natural Landmark. Attractions: hiking, views, fishing, camping.

### WALKING DUNES

Part of Hither Hills State Park on the east side of Napeague Harbor, the Walking Dunes reach a height of 80 feet as they slowly move southeast. To get to the dunes, head west on Montauk Highway and turn right at Napeague Harbor Road to the end of the paved road. Park your car here and take off on foot following the path to your right. Continue on this path and you will reach the dunes. A selfguided nature trail takes you on a three mile-long loop-trail with great views of Napeague Harbor and winds atop the ridge of the North Dune, which is the most active of the three parabolic, or U-shaped dunes. This area is a natural wonder and deceptively fragile so stay on the trails. Attractions: 80-foot high sand dunes, water birds, views of Napeague Harbor.

## **GUIDED HIKES**

The East Hampton Trails Preservation Society conducts guided hikes yearround of Montauk's trails. Go to their web site: www.ehtps.org, for hike schedules, usually held on Saturdays. The Concerned Citizens of Montauk, 631-238-5720, offer outdoor activities throughout the year. 

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


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
